HOW TO SUBMIT AN ENTRY FORM

- 1. **Use the correct form.** Please be certain to use the official Entry Form located in the back of the current Livestock Guidebook.
- 2. What to turn in:
 - o Completed Entry Form with required signatures
 - Applicable fees
 - o Release & Waiver of Liability Agreement Form with signatures
 - Large Animal Insurance Form (if required)
 - YQCA Ethics Certificate of Completion (ages 9 and up) www.YQCAprogram.org, Horse and Cavies are exempt.
- 3. **Required Signatures.** Exhibitor, Parent/Guardian (if exhibitor is under 18), and Leader/Advisor must all sign the Entry Form.
- 4. Submitting Entries. Entry Forms and fees may be:
 - o Mailed to the Fairgrounds Entry Department
 - Delivered in person to the Fairgrounds Administration Office
- 5. **Deadline.** Entries must physically arrive at the Fairgrounds Administration Office by **5:00 PM on the closing date.**
 - o Postmarks, emails, or faxed entries will not be accepted.
- 6. **Office Hours & Drop Box.** Entries may be delivered to the Administration Office between 8:00 AM 5:00 PM, Monday through Friday. For your convenience, after-hours deliveries may be placed in the secure drop box.
- 7. Incomplete Entries. Incomplete forms will not be accepted.


STATE RULES

The 2026 State Rules were not available at the time of this publication. If they become available prior to the 2026 Calaveras County Fair, they will be adopted as the governing reference. Please note: local fair rules may be **more restrictive** than state rules but cannot be more lenient.

WHO CAN ENTER?

The Calaveras County Fair Junior Livestock Program is open to **residents of Calaveras County only**, unless otherwise stated (e.g., Horse Show).

- Out-of-county exhibitors wishing to participate in the Calaveras County Fair Show and Sale must first obtain approval from **FFA**, **4-H**, **or Grange**.
- After that approval, the **39th District Agricultural Association Fair Board of Directors** will review requests on a case-by-case basis.
- Independent exhibitors are not eligible for an out-of-county waiver.



DEADLINES

December 13, 2025 - Beef Weigh-In

December 15, 2025 – Replacement Heifers must be owned & managed by exhibitor

December 15, 2025 – Beef project must be owned & managed by exhibitor

December 15, 2025 – Independent Exhibitor's Registration Form(s) for Beef Project due to the office

January 15, 2026 – Independent Exhibitor's Registration Form(s) and Lease Form(s) for Horse Project due to the office

March 15, 2026 – Goats, Sheep, Swine, Turkeys, Poultry, Rabbits, Cavies, and all Breeding Projects must be owned & managed by exhibitor

March 15, 2026 – Independent Exhibitor's Registration Form(s) for Goats, Sheep, Swine, Turkeys, Rabbits, Cavies, and all Breeding Projects (including Poultry) due to the office by March 16, 2026.

April 4, 2026 – Large Livestock Entry Forms due

April 4, 2026 – Market Poultry must be owned & managed by exhibitor

April 6, 2026 – Independent Exhibitor's Registration Form(s) for Market Poultry due to the office

April 14, 2026 – Market Rabbits must be owned & managed by exhibitor

April 14, 2026 – All Independent Registration Form(s) for Rabbits due to the office

April 14, 2026 - Small Livestock Entry Forms due



GENERAL DEFINITIONS-For Fair Purpose

- **Bred by Exhibitor** An animal bred, fed, and raised in Calaveras County by the exhibitor who owns the animal.
- Cash Awards Monies paid to successful contestants. (Synonymous with Premiums.)
- Class A group of like exhibits that are judged together; a subcategory of a division.
- **Competition** A contest between two or more exhibits.
- **Division** A generalized category of exhibits or a group of classes.
- **Entry/Exhibit** An object, project animal, or collection of objects/animals intended for exhibit.
- Stall Fees A fee charged to enter a competition. All stall fees must be submitted with the proper forms on or before the competition deadline.
- **Exhibitor** The owner of the animal.
- **Junior Livestock Committee (JLC)** A group of volunteers that facilitates the Junior Livestock Show and Sale.
- Judging Systems -
 - American Ranks exhibits against one another, awarding one first place, one second place, etc.
 - Danish Compares each exhibit on its own merit against a scorecard or recognized standard, awarding as many first placings, etc. as merited.
- Large Animals Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy Cattle, Dairy Goats (except Nigerian Dwarf), Boer Goats, Market & Fiber Goats, and Horses.
- Small Animals Poultry, Rabbits, Cavies, Pygmy Goats, Nigerian Dwarf Goats, and Avian Species.
- Entry Guidebook An entry book, prize list, contest book, or other publication specifying rules and awards for Fair contests.
- **Producer** One who raises, in normal marketable or commercial quantities within the specified area, the specific type of animal or product entered.
- **Professional** A person who engages in an event or activity for compensation (e.g., fitter or groomer).
- Senior Department Any department not considered a Junior Department.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION DEFINITIONS

- **Buyer** An individual or business that purchases an animal at the Junior Livestock Auction.
- **Seller** An exhibitor participating in the Junior Livestock Auction.
- **Declaration/Consignment for Sale** A form used by the exhibitor to declare an animal that is intended to be sold at the Junior Livestock Auction.
- **Process & Return** An animal purchased at the Junior Livestock Auction that is processed and sent to a cut-and-wrap facility for the buyer's personal use.
- **Resale** An animal purchased at the Junior Livestock Auction and resold to a designated third party. The buyer pays the difference between the bid price and the resale price offered by the third party.
- **Live Pick-Up** An animal purchased at the Junior Livestock Auction in which the buyer chooses to take the animal home live.
- **Boost** (Add-On) An opportunity for individuals to contribute additional funds toward the purchase price of an animal that has already been sold at the Junior Livestock Auction. (Also called an Add-On.)

LOCAL RULES

- 1. Large Animal Insurance Fee All Large Animal Exhibitors (Beef, Swine, Sheep, Meat Goat, Dairy Goat, and Horse) are required to pay a \$5 Large Animal Insurance Fee per family.
- 2. A "family" is defined as parents/guardians and children living together in one household.
- 3. No Refunds.
- 4. Fair-Time Exhibits All exhibits must be in place by Wednesday, May 13, 2026, per the schedule to be announced prior to Fair.
- 5. Market Poultry Must be in place by Tuesday, May 12, 2026, at 5:00 PM.
- 6. Eligibility Unless otherwise specified, all classes are open to Calaveras County residents only for the 2026 Fair.
- 7. Large Animal Entries Due to the Fair Office by Saturday, April 4, 2026, at 5:00 PM. Drop box available.

- 8. Small Animal Entries Due to the Fair Office by Friday, April 17, 2026, at 4:00 PM.
- 9. Late Entries Accepted until Friday, April 24, 2026, at 4:00 PM.
- 10.Late entry forms must include a \$100 late fee per class and must physically be in the Fair Office by the deadline.
- 11.Incomplete entries will not be accepted. No exceptions.
- 12. Entry Form Signatures All entry forms must be signed by the exhibitor, parent/guardian (if minor), and community/project leader/advisor.
- 13.Leader's name must be printed clearly on the form.
- 14. **Agreement to Rules** By signing the entry form, exhibitors, parents, and leaders agree they have read and will abide by all local and state rules.
- 15. Cash Awards Large animal breeding projects will receive premiums as follows:
- 16.1st Place: \$10 17.2nd Place: \$8 18.3rd Place: \$6
- 19. Auction Disbursements Payments to exhibitors for the Junior Livestock Auction will be distributed when adequate funds are received or within 90 days of the Auction, whichever occurs first. No partial payments will be made.
- 20. Management Authority The Fair reserves the right to cancel entries, withhold cash awards, and/or remove exhibits when exhibitors are disorderly, unsafe, or disruptive.
- 21. Non-Market Ready animals are not sale eligible.
- 22. Entry Limits Management reserves the right to limit entries to two exhibits per class if necessary.
- 23. **Liability** All reasonable care will be taken to prevent loss or damage, but the Fair will not be responsible for injury, loss, or damage.
- 24.**Independent Exhibitors** Must not have been in a junior organization with the same project within:
- 25.60 days for small livestock projects
- 26.150 days for market beef projects
- 27.120 days for horse projects
- 28.**Independent Registration Form** Must be filed by the appropriate ownership deadline.
- 29.**Rule Violations** Any person guilty of misrepresentation or violation of these rules may be disqualified and denied the privilege of showing the following year(s).

- 30.**Removal of Entries** Management reserves the right to remove any exhibit that is unsightly, unhealthy, lame, unsound, unsafe, or entered in violation of the rules.
- 31. Vehicles Vehicles in unauthorized areas will be towed at the owner's expense.
- 32. **Vehicle Passes** Admit only the vehicle. All occupants must also have a ticket or wristband.
- 33. **Alcohol Policy** Minors may not consume alcohol at any time on the Fairgrounds. Parents and chaperones are responsible for enforcement. Violations will result in disqualification of exhibits and/or prosecution.
- 34. **Illegal Substances** Possession or use of illegal substances is prohibited. Violators will be subject to disqualification and/or prosecution.
- 35. Exhibitor Conduct Abusive, unethical, fraudulent, or deceptive practices in animal preparation, handling, or presentation are prohibited.
- 36.Leader/Parent Requirements All project leaders, chapter advisors and independent exhibitor parents must attend the **Best Practices Seminar**.
- 37. **Bedding** Exhibitors must provide their own bedding.
- 38. Exhibitor Control All livestock must be under the sole control of the exhibitor to and from scales and show rings (except when an exhibitor has two animals in the same class).
- 39. Daily Care Animals must be fed and watered by 9:00 AM daily. No wheelbarrows permitted in barns after 9:00 AM until all shows conclude (Thursday–Sunday).
- 40. **Automatic Waterers** Not permitted. Defined as waterers directly connected to the Fair water system.
- 41. **Market Animals (Testicles)** Animals presenting a testicle cannot show in a market class or be moved to a breeding class.
- 42. Market Animals (Sifted at Scale) Animals rejected at scale by the veterinarian cannot be moved to breeding classes and must leave the grounds.
- 43.**Dogs** No dogs allowed on Fair property. Exhibitors bringing dogs may be asked to leave and may forfeit the opportunity to weigh their animal.



PROTEST POLICY

- 1. Grounds for Protest Only violations of state or local rules may be protested.
 - Decisions of judges, veterinarians, weigh masters, breed callers, tail dock officials, and timers cannot be protested and are final.
- 2. Deposit All protests must be accompanied by a \$500 deposit (cash, money order, or certified check made payable to Calaveras County Fair).
 - o Deposit will be returned if the protest is upheld.
 - o If upheld, the violator may be held responsible for any portion of direct costs incurred by the Fair. Failure to reimburse will result in disallowance of future entries in any California Fair.
- 3. Timeline Due to the short duration of the Fair:
 - o Protests should be filed prior to judging whenever possible.
 - o All protests must be filed in writing within 24 hours of the cause and before the conclusion of Fair.
 - o The Fair will make every effort to resolve protests quickly.
- 4. Cooperation By entering an exhibit or filing a protest, all parties agree to cooperate with Fair Management in resolving protests in a timely manner.

PROTESTS - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- 1. Protests shall be adjudicated by Fair Management and/or members of the Board of Directors.
- 2. Any exhibit involved in a filed protest before or during judging is eligible to compete until the protest is resolved.
- 3. Classes that involve a protested exhibit will not become official until the protest is resolved.
 - a. In championship or special award classes that involve the protested exhibit, the judge shall also select 1st and 2nd runners-up in case of disqualification.
 - b. In the case of protest, the unofficial judging results may be used to prepare the sale list and other necessary information.
- 4. At the discretion of the CEO, judging may be delayed allowing time for resolution of the protest, provided such delay does not unreasonably disrupt or delay fair operations, judging, or auction events.
- 5. Prior to judging the affected class, the fair may announce that an entry has been protested.

- 6. All questions concerning competition or non-protestable disputes or differences with staff or the exhibition not provided for under State or Local Rules shall be referred to the CEO or their designee (designated prior to the start of Fair). The decision of the CEO or designee shall be final.
- 7. Violations of State Rules may appeal to Fairs & Expositions (F&E) in writing.
- 8. An individual may appeal to F&E only after adjudication at the local level, and only if one of the following applies:
 - a. The decision upholds a Local Rule that circumvents or contradicts the spirit of a State Rule(s).
 - b. The individual can substantiate new and credible information that was not available at the time of the local decision.
 - c. There was inappropriate adjudication at the local level, which may have included conflict of interest, lack of due process, or significant misinterpretation of rules.
- 9. A Fair or State, national, or international organization (or subdivision thereof) with a significant stake in the interpretation of rules affecting the California fairs network may appeal directly to F&E in cases involving multiple-fair issues, industry-wide issues, unavoidable conflicts of interest, or request assistance in enforcing its own organizational rules.
- 10. No protest will be accepted unless it:
 - a. Is filed or received in writing, with both a signed original and a signed duplicate copy.
 - b. Clearly states which rule has been violated.
 - c. States when the protestor first became aware of the facts and rule violation.
 - d. States the facts relied upon for the basis of the protest.
 - e. States that the protestor will cooperate with the investigation of the protest and agrees to attend any hearing scheduled by F&E.
 - f. Includes the names of supporting witnesses, with accessible phone numbers.
 - g. Describes or attaches any supporting documents related to the protest, including the written decision issued by the local arbitrating body.
- 11.F&E must receive the appeal in writing within 24 hours of receipt of notice of the local decision.
- 12.A hearing may be conducted at the discretion of F&E. The Director of F&E may consult with and/or request participation from members of the State Rules Advisory Committee in any hearing.
- 13.Once the Director of F&E has ruled on an appeal, no additional protest or appeal will be considered regarding that incident



TICKET AND PASS INFORMATION

- Exhibitor Wristbands Available for pre-purchase on or before Tuesday, March 17, 2026. Exhibitor Admission All exhibitors are required to purchase admission passes. 4-day wristbands are available. The Cost is \$17.
- Family Members May pre-purchase admission passes at discounted exhibitor prices. The adult price is \$25.
- Exhibitor Camping A limited number of camping spaces are available; each space includes 1 parking pass.
- Parking Passes Livestock Families Only.
 - One (1) "Lot A" parking pass per family is available until sold out. The cost is \$25
 - Overflow parking passes (lot beside the ballfield) are available in limited quantities. The cost is \$25.
- Discounted Admission, Parking, and Carnival Passes Available until Wednesday, May 13, 2026, or until sold out, whichever comes first.
- Anyone camping must have a wristband or ticket. Tickets and wristbands will be checked at all gates.



AGE REQUIREMENTS

- Market and Breeding Livestock: Beef, Swine, Sheep, Goats (Market, Breeding, Dairy), Poultry (Market & Breeding), Turkey, Rabbit (Market), Horses, Llamas, and Alpacas:
 - Exhibitor must be 9 years old as of 12/31/2025.
 - o May exhibit until the calendar year in which they reach age 19.
 - FFA members may exhibit until the end of the calendar year following high school graduation.
- Other Small Animals: Pygmy Goats, Nigerian Dwarf Goats, Cavies, Breeding Rabbits, and Breeding Poultry:
 - Exhibitor must be 5 years old as of 12/31/2025.
 - May exhibit until the calendar year in which they reach age 19, unless otherwise stated.
- Independent Divisions Assignment by Age:
 - Independent, Calaveras Grange, and Pony Club members ages 5–13 as of 12/31/2025 will compete in 4-H/Grange classes.
 - Exhibitors ages 14–19 as of 12/31/2025 will compete in FFA/Grange classes.

UNIFORMS

- **FFA Show Uniform (Boys & Girls):** White shirt, blue FFA necktie or scarf, official jacket zipped to the top, white trousers/jeans, clean shoes or boots.
- **4-H Show Uniform Boys:** 4-H cap, white shirt, green 4-H tie, white pants or blue denim pants, clean shoes or boots.
- 4-H Show Uniform Girls: 4-H cap, white blouse, green 4-H scarf with plastic or metal ring, white pants or blue denim pants, clean shoes or boots.
- Calaveras Grange Uniform (Boys & Girls): Collared white shirt, red vest with Grange emblem on back, blue denim jeans (not faded), clean shoes or boots.
- **Independent Exhibitors:** White or blue jeans, white shirt, clean shoes or boots.
- **Dress Code Enforcement:** Exhibitors improperly dressed may be asked to leave the show ring.
- Rabbit, Cavy, and Poultry Exhibitors: Must wear long sleeves.

Attendance Requirement: All project leaders/advisors and parents of independent exhibitors must attend.



LARGE ANIMAL SCORE CARDS

The Junior Livestock Committee (JLC) and Fair Management hire qualified judges. Score cards are used as a tool by judges to evaluate exhibits. All judging is subjective and represents the judge's opinion on that day.

BEEF

- Market Ready: Market beef projected to have sufficient fat deposition to meet USDA "Prime," "Choice," or "Select+" quality grades.
- Non-Market Ready: Market beef lacking sufficient fat deposition to produce a desirable consumer product; projected to grade USDA "Select—" or lower.

SWINE

- Market Ready: U.S. No. 1 or No. 2 hogs of average or greater conformation, acceptable in leanness, muscularity, and production traits.
- Non-Market Ready: Any hog of below-average conformation, including U.S. No. 3, U.S. No. 4, and utility-grade hogs.

SHEEP

- Market Ready: USDA Prime or Choice quality, 12th rib back fat range 0.16–0.35, average or greater conformation and cutability.
- Non-Market Ready: USDA Good or lower quality, 12th rib back fat <0.16 or >0.35; under finished lambs, below-average conformation or cutability.

GOATS

- Market Ready: USDA Prime or Choice quality, 12th rib back fat **0.08–0.12** preferred (0.13–0.22 acceptable); average or greater conformation and cutability.
- Non-Market Ready: USDA Good or lower quality, 12th rib back fat <0.08 or >0.22; under finished goats, below-average conformation or cutability.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK RULES

GENERAL RULES

- 1. 2025 State Rules for California Fairs are available at the Fairgrounds Administration Office and online at frog-livestock.org. The 2026 rules will be available at the Fair Office when published. The said rules govern California Fairs and are not applicable to the California State Fair.
- 2. All livestock exhibitors ages 9 -19 on 12/31/25 must complete the YQCA Online Ethics Awareness Class to participate. (Not required for horses or cavies.)
- 3. **Primary Members** (ages 5–8 as of 12/31/25) may exhibit for participation only; Danish or American judging systems are **not applicable**.
- 4. Primary (Mini) Members do not pay stall fees.
- 5. Co-ops are permitted in rabbits, poultry, and turkeys only.
- 6. All animals must have **current preventative vaccines**, including but not limited to **Erysipelas for swine**.
- 7. All **poultry and turkeys** must be inspected before entering the Fairgrounds.
- 8. All sheep and goats require USDA-approved Scrapie Identification (ear tags, legible registration tattoos with papers, or electronic ID).
- 9. **Livestock pens** will be assigned by staff and approved by the **Livestock Superintendent** and cannot be changed without permission.
- 10.Designated areas will be provided for tack storage.
- 11.**Barns are species-specific**; after weigh-ins, animals must be housed in their assigned barn or designated area.
- 12.A load-in schedule for large animals will be available the first week of May.
- 13. Market poultry must be in place by 5 PM, Tuesday, May 12th.
- 14. All other livestock must be in place by Wednesday May 13th, per the schedule.
- 15.Exhibitors not bringing an animal must **notify the Livestock Office immediately**.
- 16. Official Fair IDs (ear tags, tattoos, leg bands) will be assigned at pre-fair weigh-ins or official weigh-in dates.
- 17. All animals must have Office Tag ID tags before official weigh-in.
- 18. Exhibitors are responsible for having their animals weighed at designated times.
- 19. **No animal washing** during official weigh-ins or during the Junior Livestock Auction.

- 20. **Re-weighs** must be done immediately after the first weigh-in; once an animal leaves the scale area, re-weighs are **not allowed**. Re-weighs are **not permitted for poultry, turkeys, rabbits, or cavies**.
- 21. Animals must be completely dry at official weigh-in.
- 22. Halter, leg wraps and blankets must be removed before weighing.
- 23. Market animals under the **minimum weight** are moved to feeder class; feeder animals **cannot move up** to market class. Not sale eligible.
- 24. Market animal entries per exhibitor: unlimited units **owned**, but no more than **four market units total**. Only four market units are allowed on Fairgrounds. **Trailers may be inspected at the lower gate.**
- 25. Muzzling is prohibited unless recommended by the Fair veterinarian.
- 26.Only animals **entered** may be on Fairgrounds. Natural mothers of animals that are not weaned are not allowed.
- 27. Only animals eligible for conformation classes may remain after weigh-ins.
- 28. Neck safety ties are required on all cattle.
- 29.**Stall cards** are required for each exhibit (Exhibitor name, club, breeder, animal name, breed type). Blanks available at the Livestock Office.
- 30. Animals deemed ineligible under State or Local Rules will forfeit awards and sale eligibility.
- 31.**Barn curfew:** 10:00 PM 5:00 AM. Violations may result in removal from show or auction. Fair veterinarian discretion for sick animals.
- 32. Locks are prohibited on pens.
- 33. Pens must be cleaned by **Monday, May 18th**. Fines: \$25/small pen, \$200/large animal exhibitor. Beef barn fines apply to the club/chapter.
- 34.**Tear-down schedule** for tack, stall cards, and exhibits will be provided. Market animals not in the sale may be released **Sat, May 16, 6–8 AM**. Premature removal penalties apply.
- 35.All Entries must have **Bill of Sale**; Co-ops may use club/chapter Bill of Sale. **Bred by Exhibitor** and horses must have written ownership statement.
- 36.**Grooming and Fitting:** Exhibitors must groom their own animals. Limited instruction assistance allowed from parents, siblings, leaders/chapter advisors and **other exhibitors who are exhibiting at the Calaveras County Fair.** No professional fitters or coaches may assist. Violations will result in disqualification.
- 37. Raffles: Exhibitors may not conduct a raffle of any animal during the fair.
- 38.Sale: Exhibitors may not advertise or promote the sale of any animals that are not entered in and going through the Junior Livestock Auction at the Fair on State Property.

OWNERSHIP INFORMATION

- Official ownership date is shown on **Bill of Sale**, unless **bred by exhibitor**, then **birth/calving records** are required.
- Market animals must be owned and under exhibitor care according to rules.



INDEPENDENT EXHIBITORS MUST

- 1. Provide a photo with exhibitor and animal, showing Fair-assigned ear tag, by the species ownership date.
- 2. Must submit **proof of Calaveras County school enrollment** or district transfer, for the project duration. If a child is homeschooled, the exhibitor address will be proof of eligibility.
- 3. Market animals must have an official ear tag number /band visible in photo.
- 4. Horse exhibitors must file lease information.
- 5. Must maintain a record book.
- 6. Parents must attend the mandatory Best Practices Seminar.



LIVESTOCK CODE OF ETHICS

YQCA Ethics Training Requirement


All livestock exhibitors age 9-19 and older must complete the YQCA Online Ethics Awareness Class to participate in the Calaveras County Fair & Jumping Frog Jubilee. (Mini Members ages 5–8 are exempt.) Horse and Cavies are exempt.

Key Points:

- Junior exhibitors must complete training every year.
- Intermediate exhibitors may challenge the course for a 3-year exemption.
- Senior exhibitors may challenge the course for a 3-year exemption.
- A copy of the certificate of completion or exemption must be submitted with entries every year.
- For questions or clarification, contact Kasey at (209) 736-2561.

Mandatory State Requirement

- The State of California has adopted this program for **ethics training in** youth livestock programs.
- Online training is available at: www.yqcaprogram.org
- Training must be completed before April 3, 2026.
- Completion certificate must be submitted with entries.
- This training is **required annually**. Mini Members are exempt.



Supplements

- State Rules for California Fairs
- Livestock Care and Substances Permitted on Fairgrounds
- Definition of a Drug (California Food & Agricultural Code §14202)

For the purposes of California fairs, a **drug** is defined as:

- Any substance intended for the diagnosis, cure, mitigation, prevention, or treatment of disease.
- Any substance (other than food and water) that affects the body of livestock.

Key Points:

- Purpose-driven: Defined by intended use.
- **Scope:** Includes both therapeutic substances and those altering structure or function.
- Exclusions: Food and water are *not* considered drugs under this definition.

Electrolytes

Electrolyte water contains charged minerals (sodium, potassium, magnesium, calcium) that help with hydration, muscle function, and nerve signaling.

- **Permitted:** Livestock may receive species specific electrolyte water on the fairgrounds.
- **Best Practice:** Use species-specific electrolyte products designed for livestock. These are balanced for animal needs and available at feed stores or from veterinarians.
- **Emergency Exception:** If livestock electrolytes are unavailable, a *diluted* sports drink (e.g., Gatorade) may be used temporarily, but this is not recommended for long-term care.

Considerations by Species


• Ruminants (cattle, sheep, goats):

- Risks: High sugar can disrupt rumen pH, cause bloat or acidosis;
 sodium levels may be too high; dyes/additives unnecessary.
- Sports drinks should only be used in emergencies, diluted, and as a last resort.

Monogastrics (pigs):


- Diluted sports drinks may encourage fluid intake during illness or stress.
- Provides temporary electrolytes and energy but should not replace livestock-specific products.

Except for food, water, and electrolytes, no other substances may be administered to livestock while on the <u>fairgrounds</u>. This prohibition includes, but is not limited to, the use of supplements, additives, or similar products.



Exhibitor Guidance

- Always provide clean, fresh water to your animals.
- **Do not administer** supplements, drenches, or appearance-enhancing products on fairgrounds.
- Keep livestock electrolyte powders on hand for emergencies.
- The use of **syringes or tubes** is prohibited.
- When in doubt, **consult with a veterinarian** before giving any product not classified as food, water, or electrolytes.

Eligibility

- 1. Open to **market animals** exhibited and judged in a Junior Livestock Class at the Calaveras County Fair.
- 2. Exhibitors must be Calaveras County residents to sell at the auction.
- 3. **Project Record Books** must accompany all consigned animals and be available for review by the Junior Livestock Committee at any time during the Fair.
- 4. Animals must be **officially identified** by official fair ear tag, tattoo, or leg band.
- 5. Small animal exhibitors (and their leaders/instructors) are responsible for **tagging, tattooing, or banding** their animals.
- 6. Selection of meat pens will be made **prior to official Fair weigh-in**. Exhibitors are responsible for obtaining their identification numbers from the Fair entry office.

Exhibitor Sale Rules

- 7. Each exhibitor may show up to four (4) market units.
- 8. **Champions** in FFA/Grange and 4-H/Grange **must sell** at the auction, except animals in the Donation Animal Program.
- 9. Each exhibitor may sell one large market unit and one small market unit.

Large Market Units:

• Market Beef, Market Lamb, Market Swine, Market Goat

Small Market Units:

- Pen of Meat Chickens, Pen of Meat Rabbits, Single Broiler Chicken, Single Fryer Rabbit, Single Market Turkey
- 10. Exhibitors must inform the **Livestock Office** which animals will be sold within two hours of their final conformation class. Failure to notify the office will result in being **dropped from the sale**, with a \$75 reinstatement fee (cash only) due by Friday, May 15th at 7 PM.
- 11.**Official weigh-in** determines show classes. Weight slips will be issued and attested by a Fair representative.
- 12. Sale order includes Supreme Champion, Reserve Supreme Champion, FFA/Grange Champion & Reserve, 4-H/Grange Champion & Reserve for each of the nine animal units.

Financials & Payments

- 13. **Bank of Stockton** and Fair Management handle all financial matters between buyers and consignors.
- 14. Disbursements will be made within 90 days of the auction or when funds are received—whichever comes first. No partial payments.
- 15. 6% of the gross sale price will be withheld to cover auction costs.
- 16. Animals sold are **not eligible for repurchase** from the sale committee. Responsibility remains with the exhibitor until harvested.
- 17. All poultry and turkeys are terminal—no exceptions.

Animal Care & Compliance

- 18. Sellers are responsible for restitution if an animal is **not delivered** at the close of the Fair.
- 19. **No needles, syringes, or medications** (including OTC or extra-label) are allowed on Fairgrounds.
- 20. Sale weight will not exceed class maximums listed in the Livestock Guidebook.
- 21. Animals must retain Official Fair ear tags for loading; missing tags prevent transport.
- 22. Animals declared unfit at the processing facility are the financial responsibility of the seller.
- 23. Processed market poultry or turkeys **not picked up within two weeks** will be donated to charity.
- 24. Substitutions may be allowed for **market animals that die or are shipped incorrectly**, with the exhibitor moving to the end of the sale order.
- 25. An exhibitor who is unable to sell their animal in the Junior Livestock Auction must make prior arrangements with the chairperson of the JLC.

Drug Statement

- 1. Federal law prohibits sale of adulterated or misbranded food.
- 2. Owners are responsible if animals are rejected at processing due to **drug residues**.
- 3. Wholesome Meat Act applies: only healthy animals free of drugs or chemicals may be exhibited.
- 4. Elimination times may exceed labeled withdrawal times; all labels must be followed.
- 5. Drug testing may be conducted if deemed necessary by the Fair Board or Fair veterinarian in accordance with the California Department of Food & Ag and UC Davis guidelines.





- I. Exhibitors must fill out all paperwork completely and legibly, and obtain all signatures, or paperwork will be rejected.
- J. All heifers must be naturally polled or dehorned.
- K. All heifers will be weighed in, following market beef. Minimum weight is 900 lbs.
- L. All heifers must have proof of calfhood brucellosis vaccination with presence of an official tattoo visible in the right ear.
- M. All heifers will have a pregnancy test on Wednesday of Fair, time and location to be announced at the mandatory meeting.
- N. All heifers must be bred to calve between August 1, 2026, and December 31, 2026.
- O. All heifers must be a minimum of 60 days bred on May 10, 2026.



Effective September 1, 2022, California's **Animal Confinement Regulations** established a framework for certification, registration, accreditation, and inspection under the **Animal Care Program (ACP)**. This law implements **Health and Safety Code (HSC) sections 25990–25994**, passed by California voters through **Proposition 12 (2018)**.

Requirements for Exhibitors

- Animal Care Program Certificate/Card:
 - All exhibitors must submit a copy of their ACP Certificate on the entry deadline, April 4, 2026.
 - This certificate verifies that the farm is in compliance with ACP regulations.
- Before Purchasing Animals:
 - Exhibitors should verify that breeders have an Animal Care
 Program Certification before acquiring project swine.
 - Projects without proper documentation will not be allowed to participate.
- Compliance Scope:
 - While this law applies to animals intended for **resale**, **all swine projects** at the Fair must comply.

All photos will be vetted and posted on the Calaveras County Fair's website and or social media by the office.

However, the DAA will hold all participants accountable to always conducting themselves in a professional manner. Should a participant breach this policy it is up to their supervisor to determine.
